One of the newest partnerships we have formed is with the Mercer County Trails Association looking to put in a trail along the Shenango River from Greenville to Jamestown. The group found an illegal dumpsite along the proposed trail and adjacent to the river and has asked SRW to help with the clean up process. We further discussed this partnership with the Trails Associa-



tion and the Jamestown Lions Clubs at our December board meeting. We have chosen our first clean up of 2007 on April 21st as the date to tackle this project. In advance of April 21st, SRW and the Mercer County Trails Association will organize heavy equipment to come in and do the initial moving of the dumpsite.

The DCNR grant for the master site plan for Bicentennial Park was finally completed and submitted in September. "What a relief to have it finished and in the mail," stated Jennifer Barborak, the principal writer of the grant. "I would like to acknowledge Mr. Bob Good of Pashek and Associates in Greenville. He spent a lot of time helping me review the grant and made sure I had everything in place and correct before I mailed it. I could never have sent such an impressive application without his assistance."

111,000,000 Americans Should Ask, "How Safe Is My Drinking Water"

When the federal EPA relaxes water rules, you may taste it at your tap. Especially if you live in California, New York, Pennsylvania, or seven other states with the most residents affected by a recent Supreme Court decision that will end protection for headwaters and seasonal streams under the Clean Water Act. According to the recent Sierra Club report, "from the Source to the Tap: Why America's Drinking-Water Sources Are at Risk," the tap-water supplies of more than 111 million Americans could be threatened by pollutants because these sources rely, at least in part, on streams that no longer have federal protection. Here's a look at the ten most vulnerable states:

Becki' Famous Recipes

At the Annual SRW Members' Picnic, Tom Amundsen requested that Becki Clemetson, SRW Office Assistant, include the recipes for her famous peanut butter cookies and French apple pie in the next newsletter. So here they are:

Irresistible Peanut Butter Cookies

(makes 3 dozen cookies)
3/4 Cup Creamy Peanut Butter
1/2 Cup Butter Flavor Crisco
1 1/4 Cups Light Brown Sugar, firmly packed
3 Tablespoons milk
1 Tablespoons vanilla
1 egg

1 egg 1 3/4 Cups Ali-Purpose Flour 3/4 teaspoon salt 3/4 teaspoon baking soda



- 1. Heat oven to 375 degrees.
- Combine peanut butter, Crisco, brown sugar, milk, & vanilla in a large bowl. Beat at medium speed until well blended. Add egg. Beat just until blended.
- Combine flour, salt, & baking soda. Add to creamed mixture at low speed. Mix just until blended. Drop by heaping teaspoonfuls 2 inches apart onto an ungreased baking sheet. Flatten slightly in a crisscross pattern with tines of a fork.
- Bake at 375 degrees for 7-8 minutes, or until set & just beginning to brown. Cool 2
 minutes on baking sheet. Remove cookies to cooking racks until completely cool.

French Apple Pie
(makes 1-9 inch pic)
1-9 inch umbaked pie crust using recipe of your choice

One Step Ahead

3/4 Cup of sugar
1/4 Cup flour
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
Dash of salt
6 Cups of thinly sliced tart apples

Prepare pastry for a 9 inch one crust pie. Stir together sugar, flour, nutmeg, cinnamon, and salt; mix with apples. Place apple mixture in pastry lined pie pan and top with crumb topping. Cover pie with foil. Bake at 425 degrees for 40 minutes. Remove foil and bake for 10 additional minutes.

Crumb topping: Mix: 1 cup flour, 1/2 Cup butter, and 1/2 Cup packed brown sugar. Mix until crumbly.
